





Texas Episcopalians pledge \$13M to heal those injured by its history of racism




More than 160 years after it elected a slave owner as its first bishop, the Episcopal Diocese of Texas is launching a \$13 million initiative aimed at healing individuals and communities "directly injured" by its history of racism. The funding, which the diocese called unprecedented for a racial justice project, will go toward "racial reconciliation projects and scholarships" at a number of historically black colleges, seminaries and organizations in Texas. Some of it will underwrite work by the Equal Justice Initiative, a nonprofit that established a lynching memorial in Alabama.


